SGC Neighborhood Watch Commander – Jerry Berg

The Neighborhood Watch Program was started over 25 years ago by Joe and Gloria Lee. It has been around since the very early development phase when SGC had less than 100 houses. Over the years, SGC has evolved to a community that presently has over 3200 houses. As the community expands the need for this program becomes greater as does the need for more volunteers.

The Neighborhood Watch Program is designed to assist Charlotte County Sheriff's Office with extra eyes on our beautiful community. Our primary purpose is to ensure our community is safe from attempted burglaries and vandalism, eliminate vagrants from setting up tent sites and waylay vacant lots from becoming party sites with bonfires. Developments which have a Neighborhood Watch Program generally have reduced crime rates.

The Neighborhood Watch Program does NOT eliminate the need for home security systems.

SGC is a very large development, with approximately 30 square miles of land mass, 15,000 lots, 150 miles of roads, and 55 miles of canals. Since it is so large the Neighborhood Watch Program subdivided the large area into 32 much smaller sub-areas. Each volunteer is assigned an area to conduct their watch.

The Neighborhood Watch Program is made up of Primary, Substitute, and

Roaming Volunteers. The volunteers are the BACKBONE of the program. Without the volunteers there would NOT be a Neighborhood Watch Program. The Neighborhood Watch Program issues each volunteer magnetic signs to put on their car doors and the Charlotte County Sheriff office provides vests to wear which identify them as a Neighborhood Watch volunteer while conducting their watch.

In May 2018 the Neighborhood Watch Program started having Monthly meetings on the second Thursday of each month with the Charlotte County Sheriff's Office. The meetings are held at the SGC Clubhouse. The meetings allow our volunteers to get information on crimes committed in the prior 30-day period. Anyone interested in the Neighborhood Watch Program is welcome to attend.

There are two distinct cleanup efforts: the SGC Community Cleanup, where resident volunteers team up with Charlotte County's Keep Charlotte Beautiful, and "The Adopt-A-Road" Gasparilla Road cleanup, where volunteers clean both sides of Gasparilla from Ingraham to Appleton. The Cleanup Committee's efforts have received awards and recognition from Keep Charlotte Beautiful.

The Cleanup Committee needs a new Chair because Linda Harrison, the previous Chair has moved from SGC. Another big part of the Cleanup Committee's responsibilities includes education on preventing litter and recycling. The Committee offers the following advice to keep SGC clean and pristine:

- Do not dump anything on vacant lots. Charlotte County Waste Management does not pick it up.
- **The green-lidded** trash cans are for bagged household trash, so it does not blow out on trash day.
- **The yellow-lidded** trash cans are for unbagged recyclables (except for paper).
- Yard waste should not be placed in the cans but may be placed curbside weekly, up to10 filled paper bags or containers in addition to a 4 x 4yard waste pile with pieces no longer than 6 ft.
- A transfer station (Gulfstream Blvd) is open to residents; 10 drop-offs per year.

## **Updates from the County**

The dredge project for the turn basin will start sometime after October 1: staff was able to receive grant funding for this project.

The consultant working on the parallel lock design is working towards 90% design plans. The consultant is still waiting on the Army Core of Engineers. Once plans are received, they are reviewed by staff for comments and/or changes, returned for the consultant to work on the final 100 % design plans. As stated during the last meeting, Public Works staff has included a tender house to be added to the design. This does not mean there will be a tender/tender house. However, it would be more cost efficient to include it in the plan now rather to design it later. As stated at the last meeting, since remotes have been disarmed, there have been fewer incidents and staff calls out to the lock.

The County gets questions from citizens especially during the dry season concerning when the interior canals will be dredged? Dredging is projected to start in fiscal year 2024. Please note that docksides will not be dredged, that is a homeowner's responsibility.

#### How are we funded?

SGC C.E.R.T is self-funded. There are no tax dollars provided by the County. The County only provides training for volunteers. Money is needed to maintain the trailer and stock all the necessary supplies.

## What does this mean for people living in SGC?

In case of a major disastrous event, County provided emergency services could be negatively impacted and communication may be impinged. As soon as possible and when safe to do so, SGC C.E.R.T assessment patrols would start a visual survey of our community to determine damage levels and provide aid to those that require it. If our community experiences a significant destructive incident, our C.E.R.T team would provide a first response benefit to all SGC residents.

## Wake Clarification, it's not always about speed, Look behind you



**"Idle Speed, No Wake" Zone:** A designated area where vessels must be operated at a speed no

greater than that which is necessary to maintain steerage and headway. The vessel should not produce a wake at this speed

## SLOW SPEED

**Slow Speed, Minimum Wake" Zone:** Areas where vessels must be fully off plane and completely settled in the water.

Any wake created by a vessel in one of these zones must be minimal (very small). If your vessel is traveling with the bow even slightly elevated while in one of these zones, it is not proceeding at "Slow Speed" as required by law

#### SOUTH GULF COVE STREET AND DRAINAGE MSBU

For those new to Charlotte County, Municipal Service Benefit Units (MSBU) are taxing units within

specific defined communities of Charlotte County. South Gulf Cove (SGC) is a defined community and has two MSBUs, Street and Drainage and Waterway Benefit. Each property unit within an MSBU is taxed at an assessed rate to pay for related services. Within SGC all Street and Drainage related costs which include road maintenance, repaying, sidewalks, and bike paths, right of way lawn cutting and more are charged and paid through the Streets and Drainage MSBU. Each MSBU has an advisory board made up of community residents appointed by the Charlotte County Commission. More information can be found on the county web site at www.charlottecountyfl.gov The last advisory board meeting was on July 29, 2021. Some highlights from the meeting.

- New plantings are being explored for the entryway sign planters.
- Plans are 60% complete for the extension of the sidewalk to the rest of San Domingo past Calumet.

#### BRIDGE MAINTENANCE PROGRAM:

Maintenance and construction should start within a year on the following four bridges which will include 5-foot sidewalks that tie into our current walkways. Bridge 014054 Appleton Blvd/Santa Cruz Waterway; Bridge 014053 Keystone Blvd/Santa Cruz Waterway; Bridge 014056 Ingraham Blvd/President Waterway; Bridge 014055 Keystone Blvd/ President Waterway.

Financial Reports were reviewed and there was a discussion of future assessment rate needs.

Feeding wildlife can cause more harm than good-

Here, in Florida, it is illegal to feed manatees, Sand Hill Cranes, bears, raccoons, foxes, and alligators. Although sometimes the feeding of the alligators might be accidental, yikes! Seriously, keep your small animals away from the water's edge in lagoons and waterways that house these behemoth creatures.

Also, intentionally feeding species that are listed as threatened, endangered or of special concern, including Florida scrubjays, is prohibited unless authorized by the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission. Why? For one reason, and a big reason at that, feeding the wildlife negatively impacts their feeding behavior, often causing them to become accustomed to people, associating us with "food." Do you really want a 700-pound alligator considering you the Food Dude?

Another reason is that it hinders development of natural food-gathering abilities, stunting their health. Much of our human food is junk to mother nature's darlings and our junk food is even worse. Our typical food items remain a poor substitute for their natural diet and some of it can even be toxic.

The more potent problem, though, is learned behavior. Once an animal associates a human with food, she loses her natural fear and wariness, resulting in an unpredictable array of conduct. Today, she seems cute because she placed her little hand on your foot but tomorrow will not be so cute when she slices up your face in search of more peanuts.

They're wild animals, for goodness' sake. Remember that, please!
