

Operating under the umbrella of CCT, the Community Emergency Response Team (CERT Team) is a dedicated group of highly motivated residents from SGC who have volunteered to take the required training for the purpose of forming and developing our local group. The heart of the CERT program is "A Neighbor Helping Neighbor."

How are we funded?


CERT is self-funded. There are no tax dollars provided by the County. The County only provides training for volunteers. Funding is needed to maintain the trailer and stock all the necessary supplies.

What does this mean for you?

In case of a major disastrous event, County provided emergency services could be negatively impacted and communication may be impinged. As soon as possible and when safe to do so, CERT assessment patrols start a visual survey of our community to determine damage levels and provide aid to those who require it. If our community experiences a significant destructive incident, the CERT team would provide a first response benefit to all SGC residents.



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




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Neighborhood Watch program Help Protect SGC

The **Neighborhood Watch Program** started over 25 years ago and has been around since the neighborhood's early development phase when SGC had less than 100 houses. Over the years, SGC has evolved to a community that presently has over 3,600 houses.

The program is designed to assist Charlotte County Sheriff's Office with extra eyes on our beautiful community.

Its primary purpose is to ensure our community is safe from attempted burglaries and vandalism, eliminate vagrants from setting up tent sites, and waylay vacant lots from becoming party sites with bonfires.

The Neighborhood Watch Program does not eliminate the need for home security systems.

The Neighborhood Watch Program is made up of Primary, Substitute, and Roaming Volunteers. The volunteers are the BACKBONE of the program. Without the volunteers there would NOT be a Neighborhood Watch Program. Each volunteer is issued a magnetic sign to put on their car door and the Charlotte County Sheriff's office provides vests which identify them as a Neighborhood Watch Volunteer.



WE LOOK OUT FOR EACH OTHER

Monthly meetings are held at the SGC Clubhouse on the second Thursday of each month with the Charlotte County Sheriff's Office and anyone interested in the program is welcome to attend.

The Yacht Club was founded in 1990 by members of the South Gulf Cove Community. Currently our membership consists of over 320 member households (670 individuals).


The **SGC Yacht Club** has been recognized as the premier social organization within South Gulf Cove. The group organizes a wide range of events and activities, both on water and on land.

"Idle Speed, No Wake Zone"

A designated area where vessels must be operated at a speed no greater than that which is necessary to maintain steerage and headway. The vessel should not produce a wake at this speed.

"Slow Speed, Minimum Wake Zone"

Areas where vessels must be fully off plane and completely settled in the water. Any wake created by a vessel in one of these zones must be minimal (very Small) If your vessel is traveling with the bow even slightly elevated while in one of these zones, it is not proceeding at "Slow speed" as required by law

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SGC Waterway Advisory Board Report

The MSBU Advisory Board met on March 9 and the meeting was well attended by our community.

Staffing the Lock

The board made two unanimous recommendations regarding the lock. One was to spend up to \$300,000 annually on a temporary building and a tender to man the lock 12 hours a day, 365 days a year. At other times, the lock will be self-operated. This issue has been discussed at several meetings. Community input strongly favored a lock tender and it seemed clear the community would benefit from the efficiency gained by having a tender there during the day. The current MSBU assessments will cover the cost of the tender for the foreseeable future (Until a second lock is constructed), County staff strongly favored staffing of a lock to help

make the lock more efficient and have fewer mechanical issues as the lock gets busier as we grow as a community. The next step is County Commissioner approval, with a temporary building and lock tender to hopefully be in place by Fall.

The second recommendation was to have security cameras installed at the lock to cover both boats coming and going, the lock itself, and the control building/tender house and road. County staff also agreed this was important. We hope to receive approval from the county legal team and move forward with this project as well.

Other Business

The Advisory Board reviewed and discussed the dredging project underway on the bay side of the lock

which will bring the channel to a depth of 5 ft MLLW (mean lower low water) from the lock out to markers 1 and 2. Budget was discussed, including the cost of the new parallel lock, planning for and dredging of the canals as needed in upcoming years.

The new water management staff reported on the water quality, which is especially important for the sustainability of our community, the canals.

Public works staff reported on the project status for repair and maintenance at the lock. The current list of repair and maintenance projects includes adding an additional piling, replacing pilings as needed, replacing the boards inside the lock as needed, underwater cleaning of the lock from marine growth, repair of the bayside float, and adding ladders from the water to the docks at both sides of the lock. Additionally, the chains at each location of the lock will be phased out, as an improved button system is installed at the control boxes. This system will be designed at two heights to accommodate boats of varying size and operate in such a way that using the buttons does not push the boat away from the control box. Community input suggested installing cleats on each piling to make it easier for boats to tie up and to add more and better lines to inside the lock. Both suggestions were favorably received by county staff and will be included in the pending RFP.

About Us

The SGC Waterway MSBU Advisory Board is made up of property owners of SGC appointed by the County board of Commissioners to advise on specific issues around the waterway. With community input, the board makes recommendations to the County for budget expenditures in accordance with the law and Commissioner approved guidelines. The purpose of the SGC Waterway MSBU is to provide for (1) periodic dredging, (2) repairs, expansions or replacement of the waterways, canals, locks, or facilities, (3) lock operation, and (4) removal of cattails from the Interceptor Lagoon waterway.

The SGC Waterway MSBU Advisory Board advises county commissioners but remember you can also provide feedback directly to the commissioners at

charlottecountyfl.gov/commissionoffice.


SGC STREET AND DRAINAGE MSBU Report

Ronald Wozniak, Chair, Advisory Board SGC Street and Drainage MSBU

For those new to Charlotte County, Municipal Service Benefit Units (MSBU) are taxing units within specific defined communities of Charlotte County. South Gulf Cove (SGC) is a defined community and has two MSBUs, Street and Drainage and Waterway Benefit.

Each property unit within an MSBU is taxed at an assessed rate to pay for related services. Within SGC, street and drainage related costs which include road maintenance, repaying, sidewalks and bike paths, right of way lawn cutting, and more are charged and paid through the Streets and Drainage MSBU.

Each MSBU has an advisory board made up of community residents appointed by the Charlotte County Commission.

The following are highlights from last meeting.

- Extension of the sidewalk to the rest of San Domingo past Calumet: Construction started in March 2022.
- Maintenance and construction should start by the end of the year on the following four bridges: Bridge 014054 Appleton Blvd/Santa Cruz Waterway; Bridge 014053 Keystone Blvd/Santa Cruz Waterway; Bridge 014056 Ingraham Blvd/President Waterway; Bridge 014055 Keystone Blvd/President Waterway. Sidewalks on bridges changed from 5ft. to 8ft width, which will tie in better to our 10 ft. sidewalks.
- Financial Reports were reviewed and there was a discussion of future assessment rate needs. No change is expected through 2023.


